REFLECTION

"For now we see through a glass darkly"

"For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known". (Corinthians 13:12)

Paul's Great Paean of Love in 1 Corinthians describes a journey of discovery, a journey in love as we each individually and together discover each other and, in God our true selves. A journey where love finds no difference between all people, but instead rejoices in it, between people whose gender identity coincides with that expected by biological sex, and for those it does not. In that glass we see the light of the hope of that love, and also the fear of the darkness that surrounds it. On this Transgender Day of Remembrance we encounter that darkness expressed in transgender lives attacked through persecution, rejection and death by the hands of others, or by suicide. Destroying lives of people and of families who try to live in ways that are true to their own identities, true to themselves and true to God's love. Yet instead of working towards greater understanding and acceptance of each other the recent proposals by the United Kingdom government to allow people to self-define the gender identity they belong to, for legal purposes only, a toxic argument has been created between those for whom social identification must be determined by gender identity and those for whom social identification must be fixed by biological sex. An outcome of the latter attitude is found in the present suggestions by the executive administration in the United States to legislate transgender people legally out of existence. This is by decreeing that social identification must be determined by biological sex identified by the genitalia at birth, regardless of any changes through surgery or otherwise that are made. Yet in the Bible we are all called to be as one: we are all called to be truly ourselves in the Love of Christ. Today we remember the hurt and distress that this discrimination and hate has caused to transgender people. In the face of this darkness when: "Now we know in part, but then we shall know just as we are also are known". So, today we must commit ourselves, all of us, to disperse that darkness and build the true welcome for everyone, transgender people included, which finds its complete inclusion and fulfilment in the Love of Christ.

REMEMBRANCE

We remember now by name some/all of the 368 transgender people who have died by the hands of others or by suicide in the last twelve months

INCLUSION

Grant us Lord that we may create true, caring and compassionate Churches which welcome all equally who seek to fulfil Your love in the world, irrespective of race, class, tribe, gender and sexual identities, and all other differences that identity provides. Help us to dispel the fear and lack of understanding which bars anyone from entry to the Institutions that we for Your worship and service create.

WORLD

In a world where social divisions by power and gender remain and fear and prejudice continues to exist, one in eight transgender employees have been physically attacked by a colleague or customer in the last year. In the United Kingdom half of transgender people have hidden their identity at work for fear of discrimination. A quarter of transgender people have experienced homelessness two in five trans people who would like to undergo medical intervention as part of their transition, haven't done so yet, because they fear the consequences it might have on their family life. Almost half of transgender people don't feel comfortable using public toilets through fear of discrimination or harassment. A third of transgender people have been discriminated against because of their gender identity when visiting a café, restaurant, bar or nightclub in 2017. More than a quarter of transgender people who were in a relationship in 2017 have faced domestic abuse from a partner. More than two in five transgender people avoid certain streets because they don't feel safe there. One in four transgender people were discriminated against when looking for a house or flat to rent or buy in the last year. One in five non-binary transgender people have experienced discrimination while looking for a new home. When accessing general healthcare services in 2017, two in five transgender people said healthcare staff lacked understanding of transgender health needs. More than a third of transgender students in higher education have experienced negative comments or behaviour from staff in 2017². Help us to build a world where such discrimination disappears and all are welcome in the Love of Christ

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed": Help us Lord to bring that freedom to the world.
