Psalm 139.7-18

OLD TESTAMENT

Speaker 3

Reading from Isaiah 53

They were despised and rejected by others, a person of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom others hide their faces they were despised, and we esteemed them not. Surely, they took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered them stricken by God, smitten by them, and afflicted. But they were pierced for our transgressions, they were crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon them, and by their wounds we are healed.

Reading from 1 Corinthians 12.14-26

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you."

On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.

We pray for those in need, for a deeper understanding of your joy and purpose for us all, and for the fulfilment of your vision of dynamic unity: in which 'there is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female' for we are all 'one in Christ Jesus' (Gal 3.28). As we celebrate the work of your grace in making us new creations, help us come home to your peace and enable others to be at home with you, with themselves, and with all that you have created.

We pray for welcoming hearts and arms to embrace.

Like the parent in Jesus' story, who rushed out to meet their offspring with your profound mothering love, enable us to let go of our inherited prejudices and inhibitions. that we may joyfully receive one another's diverse gifts and thus be fully reconciled and renewed together in your love.

We pray for the Church, that it may fully recognise, affirm and celebrate the lives, bodies and gifts of its gender diverse members. Enable the Body of Christ to support those who suffer, to enable those who seek to thrive, and to welcome all fresh insights into what it is to become a new creation in God's love.

We pray for our wider communities and world, that they too may embrace the gifts of gender diversity. We ask for a true spirit of listening and commitment on the part of politicians, media and other opinion formers. Strengthen those who bring light rather than heat and lift the clouds of ignorance, fear and oppression.

We pray for healing and renewal for all who struggle with gender dysphoria, particularly those rejected by family and other loved ones. We give thanks for those who minister with them: for families and loved ones who are supportive; for informed and caring health professionals; for life-giving support networks, agencies and individuals; and, above all, for fellow gender diverse people who walk in solidarity.

God of kaleidoscopic love, we give thanks for all those who have gone before us, especially our gender diverse forbears who are numbered among the saints. Inspired by their love, faith and courage, grant that we, and all your people, may come home to your abiding love, know your peace, strength and joy, and flourish more fully in your eternal presence,

¹ The Celtic Church developed a special type of protection prayer, the Caim Prayer or Circle Prayer, it is where we get the word "Calm" from as praying this prayer would banish the storm and create calm. It was a way to surround oneself with God's protection and blessing and remove any evil. It was often prayed in by 'drawing' a circle around oneself as you prayed, at every 90 degree, turn. This is an example of a Celtic circle Prayer:
